## **Marine Towers West**

Rita Ryland, 65, lives in San Francisco most of the year. She and her husband have an apartment there that looks out over the San Francisco Bay. When they began to anticipate their retirement years, they thought they would try living in Cleveland before deciding whether to move here permanently. Five years ago, they rented an apartment at Marine Towers West at 12540 Edgewater Drive.

"I rented the apartment sight unseen," Ryland said. "I did an online search for 'Lake Erie views in Cleveland,' and Marine Towers West popped up." She called the manager and trusted his word that the view was spectacular.

The Rylands' Gold Coast apartment has two bedrooms, two baths and a solarium that overlooks Lake Erie.
